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GRAHAM CREEK NATURE PRESERVE

The 487-acre preserve serves as Foley's back yard, offering rustic hiking trails, a kayak launch, youth and adult archery ranges, two 18-basket disc golf courses, an outdoor classroom, and a picnic pavilion all in pristine surroundings. Here you'll find a quiet space to enjoy wildflowers, bird watching and a nice sunset—or an idyllic setting for outdoor experiences on the creek or trails. The preserve and restroom facilities are open daily from dawn to dusk. WOLF CREEK PARK

This almost-hidden park provides access to Wolf Creek, offering a kayak launch for non-motor vessels. The boardwalk through the beautiful wetland full of cypress trees opens to the main channel for fishing and bird watching. And the picnic pavilion provides a peaceful place to relax and refuel before the next adventure. 9575 Wolf Creek Road, Elberta, Alabama.

FOLEY RAILROAD STATION

Stop in at the historic depot and explore several attractions.

The Depot Museum displays photos and memorabilia that document Foley's history and the important part the railroad played in developing this area. Hours are Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday, 10 a.m.–4 p.m. Wednesday and Saturday, 10 a.m.– 2 p.m. 125 E. Laurel Ave., Foley, Alabama.

The Model Train Exhibit delights all ages with the impressive "O" gauge train display that covers a quarter mile of track. The Caboose Club will keep everyone entertained with trains and stories. It's open Tuesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays, 10 a.m.–2 p.m.

All aboard! Enjoy a train ride around Heritage Park. Weather permitting, free rides are offered on Saturdays, 10 a.m.–2 p.m. year-round, plus Tuesdays and Thursdays 10 a.m.–2 p.m. during the summer months. Board in front of the Depot Museum at 125 E. Laurel Ave.

COASTAL ALABAMA FARMERS AND FISHERMENS MARKET

TUESDAYS 9 AM - 2 P

Get the freshest ingredients at our local market, where you can purchase fruits and vegetables straight from the farmers who grew them. Fresh Gulf seafood from shrimp to fillets, and grass-fed beef and pork, are also available. Open Tuesdays and Saturdays, 9 a.m.–2 p.m. at 20733 Miflin Rd. Foley, Alabama.

Holmes Medical Museum

Visit Baldwin County's first hospital, which served this area from 1936 until 1958. Take the self-guided tour to learn about medical equipment and patient rooms as they would have appeared in the 1930s and '40s. Open Monday through Friday, 10 a.m.–2 p.m., plus Saturdays, 10 a.m.–2 p.m., during the summer months. Located at 111 W. Laurel Ave. Foley, Alabama.



ANTIQUE ROSE TRAIL

Take a walk along the Wilbourne Antique Rose Trail and enjoy the immense beauty and fragrance of hundreds of heritage roses. The nearly mile-long trail follows a path parallel to Highway 59 through historic Foley, and is open from dawn until dusk. Ample parking is available at Heritage Park. Roses are at peak bloom in early spring, but the nicely landscaped trail is a lovely place for walking throughout the year. www.VisitFoley.org
